The Maastricht Interview: Social and biographical approaches to voice hearing - a lived experience perspective

Two Day CPD Workshop at Lancaster University

13th & 14th July 2017

Designed for professionals who are working in mental health and psychiatric services this workshop is facilitated by Peter Bullimore and Kate Crawford, two people with experience of voice hearing who are highly experienced in delivering training on this topic.

The traditional approach to working with voice hearers focusses upon inabilities and deficits, rather than individuals' inherent ability to understand and cope with their voices and other experiences. This course is grounded on acceptance of lived experiences of voice hearing. Participants will be taught to employ the Maastricht Interview, an assessment tool developed by Dr Sandra Escher and Professor Marius Romme, which provides a structured method for understanding and working with a voice hearer's experience.

£200 for this two day workshop with the option of attending a third day for an additional cost. This workshop also forms part of an accredited postgraduate module which can be used towards a Postgraduate Qualification. A reduced rate of £100 is available for current Lancaster University students.
